Romantic comedy

The film's enduring appeal and popularity led to lasting recognition when the highest Slovenian movie award, the Vesna, was named after this film. This romantic comedy about three students falling for the same girl is one of the most popular movies of all time in Slovenia. Written by Matej Bor (nom du plume of Vladimir Pavšič), the poet of Slovenian resistance who later defended dissident artists, and directed by a Czech émigré import František Čáp, the film starred the most beautiful engineering student to ever grace the big screen, Metka Gabrijelčič (she left movies after making one more film with the same director, saying that she preferred a real-life career over acting). A crowd pleaser that won every critic who ever saw it, VESNA is also the story of a country looking to the future with youthful optimism. Young men pilot sailplanes, girls have fun in an all-female paratrooper class, and three students woo the daughter of their math professor in hopes of getting the sealed answers to the upcoming finals...Complications ensue, but none too serious that a kiss wouldn't cure.
